

SHARADHA GOPALAKRISHNAN

A woman adores many roles- Daughter, sister, mother, wife, professional and family gives her many roles. How many of us do them with near perfection? How many of us make our painful path of traveling in life, an inspirational one to others? Sharadha, completing her Visual Communication had a big dream in her profession which helped her land in Photography. She is passionate in what she does and can never stop herself from photographing. Her world inside her brain is anytime beautiful and she expresses them through her pictures. When she underwent a loss – still birth, she never realized, her life would change from then on. She began making noise and slow got noticed for the movement that she created - Pregnancy loss and still birth awareness, especially in India. She has done various projects to emphasize on the importance of care and support for a mother of an angel. Her works have got her bunch of awards and recognition, including Inspirational Global Woman Awards, AFNS Awards, RISE Award, UNLEASH YOU- Exceptional woman of excellence awards and so on.

1. How did it all begin to start with Smiley Media? What was your spark to get into photography as an entrepreneur?

To commence with, let me take you down the memory lane on how Smiley Media came into existence. While I was pursuing my college final year in 2011, I started Smiley Media. Wondering how this spark hit my mind?

Actually, in the beginning I joined Engineering but then I quit it. With immense interest in connecting to Media, I joined Viscom. So, right from the college days, I had a clear vision of entering into media. In fact, my ambition was to somehow get into anything that is related to art, film making, photography, designing etc... So yes, the spark was there within me since college days. Since my childhood, I was not very studious. I was more captivated towards arts, photography, film making and was keen in fine tuning my creative skills. That is how my interest drove me into starting this venture and now Smiley Media is live.

2. How did Ahaana Photography become a part of yours? Tell us about your angel Ahaana Barathi.

Ahaana Bharathi is damn special and without Ahaana, Ahaana Photography would not have come into existence. It is right indeed to remark that she made me feel proud and I was on cloud nine because of her. Though I was into depression after I lost her, she boosted me up and helped me get over everything. Under her guidance and puppetry play, everything is going on in an apt way. My child is the supreme existence, The God to me. She is the director who dictates the happenings in my life and I'm just a puppet in her hands. I'm just executing her instructions. Without her, Ahaana Photography would just be a nightmare and would not have come into existence.

3. Creating awareness about Post-Partum depression – this is a very sensitive yet an important topic to spread to the present gen parents. How successful were you to spread this awareness? Did you foresee any challenges in doing so?

My clients are mothers. Every day I come across so many mothers. Behind a child's birth, there are numerous stories that a mother cherishes, though it may be painful most of the times. 90% of the stories would be like there is no happiness in them. Most of them face a lot of challenges. Many of us are aware of postpartum depression. Most of the mothers are affected due to this depression. But this is not brought into lime light by many. So, I felt that I should definitely open up about this. Because many of them may not be exactly aware about the challenges. Doctors might know and can talk but they are held up with a lot of works which might not permit them to voice out about this. I strongly felt the urge to let the society understand the plight of mothers and to create awareness about it in the society. In movies, too they just show how mothers sing a lullaby and make their kids nap. But not many movies expose the challenges faced by women. Being a woman, I wanted to let the society know this. Many creative ideas stuck my mind to create a lot of awareness about this amongst the people. I am managing to create awareness in all the possible ways and means but in the due course I am facing a lot of hurdles. The main thing is the financial problem as it is a personal project. I am facing financial crisis in executing this but I will never give up. I am working on earning more. As I earn more, I shall penetrate deep into this. I just want to earn more so as to serve more in this regard.

4. Your projects through Ahaana photography are very unique and sensitive. How do you get such ideas? Share some of your projects to audience.

"In fact a lot of queries popped up in my mind. When we receive a project from a client, the client is ready to bear the expenses which are totally different. When it comes to a personal project, the effort is totally ours and also the expenses. There were innumerous questions in mind: Will people accept this? Will this have an impact?









Will everyone understand the intention behind this? Will I be able to convince people in the right way? There were many such doubts in my mind initially. But I was fortunate indeed to witness an immense reach. A lot of mothers came forward voluntarily to share their stories. Opening up their heart to someone is not easy and I am glad that I was able to achieve it. With the tremendous team effort of all the mothers, I could feel the awareness being spread. Many of them came forward to share their stories to their husband or mother in law so that they just realize the challenges and render the necessary support. Hence, it was a huge success. Here, the success I am speaking about is on seeing the video at least one percent of the husbands or mother in laws would have felt that they should have treated the wife or daughter in law in a better way. At least it would create an impact and they would definitely be able to realize that their wife or mother in law is going through a serious depression. Even if 1% of them are able to realize this, then I think that I have succeeded because my intent is fulfilled to an extent."

5. Breast feeding – one of your peculiar projects from Ahaana Photography. What were the criticisms faced? How was the response?

Breast feeding project was mainly to stress that breast is to feed. Sometimes, mothers even feel shy to feed in front of me. While traveling in a car, they stop the car and look in for a hidden place to feed the kid. We will need to normalize all these and kids need to be fed immediately when they are feeling hungry just as we eat immediately as we feel hungry. So, to normalize this and spread awareness I started this breast feeding project. Of course, this had a good reach. There was an equal amount of criticism too. A few women were of the view that this should not be exposed openly. But the support that I received was immense which helped me traverse towards my intention. I started receiving so many stories around breast feeding too and that was the whole point in undertaking this project. Motherhood is sacred and can be considered as a common religion pertaining to all the mothers. They belong to one community. It gives me immense happiness to see that they get along with each other without any discrimination. This is all about my breast feeding project.





6. Your message for angel mothers?

The lost child will definitely be an angel to a mom. Just how the three wise men were guided by the star to reach Jesus, these mothers will always have their angels as a guiding star that will help them reach the heights they aspired for. They stay as a guiding star with their parents and the loved ones. At this point, I would like to reiterate one thing. Take your time to heal yourself. Don't ever feel that you should hide your pain as it will affect the people around you. Never hide your sorrows behind your fake smile. We should not cheat ourselves by masking ourselves from the reality. At the same time, one can do anything and can go to any extreme to taste joy and happiness. I shower my immense love and hugs to all the sacred mothers who have lost their little angels. While we are trying to cope up with this and change, we will need to understand that things will get better along with babies and only things around us will change. It is not necessary to forget everything and open up a new fresh page in the journey of your life. If circumstances force you to do so, do not get trapped into it. Only if the inner soul in you triggers your mind and soul to forget all this and move on, then you have all the rights to traverse as per your intuition and intention. I just wanted to quote that decide what you want and sail according to it. Do anything that will not make you feel guilty and the ultimate aim is happiness. Happiness and peace is the only focus and you can do anything to achieve it.

I managed to capture my journey of healing by writing it. My Book "Out of focus" is available out in the amazon. You can grab it for a read. One needs constant support to overcome the grieving phase. And, I am glad that I had enough support, from my friends who are my family.

7. Being a Startup entrepreneur who achieved a great success with both Smiley Media and Ahaana Photography, what do you think are the most common mistakes that almost all the startups commit? What will be your advice on dealing with their problem?

"The failure of most of the start ups is because they fail to have a proper process set up in their place. They fail to take good care of their account, and their team. These are the major reasons for the failure of a start up. So, if there is good process and you know it is all set and u know good flow. A start up can never be a one man show, for any start up, theentire team is important. It can be a team of 2, 4, 10 or 20 and so on. The success of a start lies on how effectively the team is managed.

8. Please share your favorite life quotations (at least 3) with our audience

"I am reminded of the lines from the great poet, Bharathiyar's poems. I just wanted to convey the essence of it: Everything that I envisage should be fulfilled. My thoughts should be noble. I need a resolute heart. I need a good intellect that has clarity...."" I like all the poems that were penned by the great poet, Bharathiyar and this is the most favourite amongst all. It would be rather unfair if I don't mention my favourite quote here: ""What you seek is seeking you."

I would like to quote here a famous saying of the father of our nation on Customer service. Those words still linger in my mind. You can also spot more than 20 statues of Santa around town, offering many seasonal photo ops. Santa Claus has a Christmas-themed amusement park called Holiday World, but ironically it is not open during the Christmas season. Holiday events in Santa Claus include: Santa Claus Christmas parade, The story of Santa Claus at the Santa Claus Museum & Village, Run Run Rudolph 5K through Lake Rudolph's Santa Claus Land of Lights, Face painting and Christmas woodcarving demonstrations at Holly Tree Christmas Shop, Chestnuts roasting on an open fire at Santa's Candy Castle, which commenced in 1935 as a Christmas-themed attraction in the US, Gingerbread house decorating at the Santa Claus Christmas Store, Christmas dinner with Santa at Santa's Lodge and Christmas Lake Village Festival of Lights: Families looking to give added bang for your buck on a retreat to Santa Claus should consider one of the Christmas packages the local visitor center has put together. 
10. A Smoky Mountain Christmas:




MEANING IN ENGLISH

POWERED BY PLANET WEALTH

ISuccessful investing can be really hard in times like the present. Falls in share markets and other assets are stressful as no one likes to see their wealth decline and the natural inclination is to retreat to safety. From their highs last year or early this year to recent lows US and global shares have fallen about 25%. Australian shares have held up better, remaining up from their June low at which point they had had a fall of 16% from their high in August last year, but they remain vulnerable to the lead from global shares. While shares have managed to find technical support in recent days and could bounce further given high levels of negative sentiment, the near-term downside risks for shares remain high, reflecting the same array of macro risks that have been weighing on them all year, notably:

- high inflation and ultra-hawkish global central banks;
- the \$US trending up on safe haven demand and Fed rate hikes risking a financial accident - with mayhem in the UK adding to fears of crisis;
- an escalation in the Ukraine war, along with other geopolitical risks;
- · high and still rising recession risks; and
- downwards revisions to earnings expectations flowing from all this.

We had a detailed look at the issues a few weeks ago along with signs of light at the end of the tunnel (see here), but I will be the first to admit my crystal ball gets even hazier at times like the present. As always, the turmoil in markets is being met with lots of prognostication. Some of which is enlightening but much is noise. But to borrow one of my favourite quotes that Mark Twain is said to have said "history doesn't repeat but it rhymes". While the weakness we are going through differs in detail from rough patches in the past, basic investment principles still apply. It's hard to say anything new other than to reiterate them.

RECESSION FEARS.

So, apologies if you have seen "seven things for investors to keep in mind" from me before, but at times like this they are worth revisiting.

#1 Share market falls are normal – the key is to make the most of the power of compound interest

First, while they all have different triggers and unfold differently, periodic share market falls are healthy and normal. Sometimes they are just 5% to 20% corrections, but every so often they can be deep bear markets with falls up to around 50% as in the GFC. But while share market pullbacks can be painful, it's the way the share market has always been, so they are nothing new. As can be seen in the next chart shares climb a wall of worry over many years but with numerous events dragging them down periodically, but with the long-term rising trend ultimately resuming.

Australian shares have climbed a wall of worry.

Bouts of volatility are the price we pay for the returns from shares higher longer-term compared to other assets like cash and bonds. The next chart shows the value of \$1 invested in various Australian assets in 1900 allowing for the reinvestment of dividends and interest along the way. That \$1 would have grown to \$243 if invested in cash, to \$881 if invested in bonds and to \$691,806 if invested in shares. While the average return since 1900 is only double that in shares relative to bonds, the huge difference between the two at the end owes to the impact of compounding returns on top of returns. So, if we want to grow our wealth we need an exposure to growth assets like shares to make the most of the power of compound interest, but with that comes rough patches every so often.

#2 The key is not to get thrown off by cyclesselling shares after a fall turns a paper loss into a real loss

When shares are falling sharply its naturally tempting to sell. At least it may then be easier to sleep at night. But selling shares or switching to a more conservative investment strategy whenever shares suffer a cyclical setback just turns a paper loss into a real loss with no hope of recovering.

#3 Timing is hard

Of course, you may be thinking "but I will reinvest once uncertainty is removed". But the risk is you don't feel confident to get back in until long after the market has fully recovered, which may be well above the level you sold out at. Trying to time the market is very difficult. A good way to demonstrate this is with a comparison of returns if an investor is fully invested in shares versus missing out on the best (or worst) days.

#4 Share market pullbacks provide opportunities

When shares and all assets fall in price, they're cheaper and offer higher long-term return prospects. As a result of the fall in share and bond prices (and the resultant decline in PEs and rise in dividends yields and bond yields) our estimated medium term return projections for a diversified growth mix of assets has improved from around 4.9%pa to around 6.7%pa. So, the key is to look for opportunities' pullbacks provide. It's impossible to time the bottom but one way to do it is to "average in" over time.



#5 Australian shares offer an attractive dividend yield

This is particularly so compared to bank deposits. Companies don't like to cut their dividends, so the income flow you are receiving from a well-diversified portfolio of shares is likely to remain attractive, particularly against bank deposits even though deposit rates are slowing rising.

#6 Shares invariably bottom with maximum bearishness

Shares and other related assets often bottom at the point of maximum bearishness, ie, just when you and everyone else feel most negative towards them. This is when investors have lots of cash on the sidelines which provides fuel for an eventual rebound. This is the point of maximum opportunity. This is obvious in a way because shares could hardly bottom when everyone is already bullish because there would be no one to buy. The problem is that it's hard for most people to commit to buying shares when there is so much gloom around. And, of course, investor sentiment could still get more negative in the short term before it bottoms.

#7 Turn down the noise

At times like this, negative news reaches fever pitch. Talk of billions wiped off share markets and warnings of disaster help sell copy and generate clicks & views. But we are rarely told of the billions that market rebounds and the rising long-term trend in share prices adds to the share market. Moreover, they provide no perspective and only add to the sense of panic. All of this makes it harder to stick to an appropriate long-term strategy let alone see the opportunities that are thrown up. So best to turn down the noise on all the negative news flow (and watch Elvis films).




